## ІСЕНОТЕL (ЛЬОДОВИЙ ГОТЕЛЬ)

Icehotel— найвідоміший готель не лише у Швеції, а й у світі. Унікальність цього готелю розглянуто в поданих тезах.

Since 1989 in the village of Jukkasjarvi courses are held for the production of ice sculptures. Due to the large number of people wishing to attend courses, it was decided to place guest house in the snow next to the icy works of art. Thus was born the Ice Hotel. Perhaps, this is crazy, but it is unique, and this hotel knows worldwide. This is a risky idea that inspires.

Now every winter from the frozen Torne River in Jukkasjarvi cut ice. Builders and artists start to work with ice blocks huge size and a month later the frantic work – cutting, sawing, punching – obtained Icehotel and ice bar. Every winter, about 50 000 visitors from all over the world come to see the ICEHOTEL in complete tranquility and enjoy the northern lights in the icy wilderness 200 kilometers from the Arctic Circle.

The temperature inside the building is minus five degrees, while it is on the street -15. Guests are provided with warm outer clothing, including overalls, boots, gloves and warm hats, masks. Organizer of the recommended thermal underwear to wear during your stay. And guests spend the night in special sleeping bags designed for extreme polar conditions.

However, the night spent in a luxurious interior with fancy patterns—the pleasure is not cheap. Cheapest double room "snow room" is located within 3200 SEK per night—which is equivalent to about 6000 UAH. And in the room can be found only a bed and a couple of chairs, a bathroom available. Shared bathrooms are located in the adjacent building, which was built already from more traditional materials. The cost of the most expensive luxury rooms is 7500 SEK per night—which is equivalent to approximately 14,600 UAH. In it you'll find a huge bed, lounge area, a sauna and a personal toilet, which, fortunately, are not made of ice and snow.
