

TOP 5 UNUSUAL HOTELS IN THE WORLD (5 НЕЗВИЧАЙНИХ ГОТЕЛІВ СВІТУ)

Мешканці міських квартир радикально змінюють умови життя тільки під час відпустки. Але з часом розуміють: готелі навіть в різних країнах в більшості своїй схожі один на одного. Проте існують особливі. І переночувати в одному з таких – саме по собі пригода.

1. Chateau de Bagnols (France, Rhone): The historical monument, which many in France consider to be a masterpiece of Romanesque architecture, was turned into a luxury hotel in the ninth century of its existence. Powerful walls with viewing towers are surrounded by a moat, overlooking the French garden and Beaujolais vineyards. The interiors with wall murals and antique furniture are decorated by designers of the best fashion houses in France.

2. Icehotel (Sweden, Jukkasjärvi): This art project of snow and ice is already 25 years old. Every winter, the hotel premises are rebuilt in a new way. The material is the frozen water of the unique Tourne Elv River, which has never been used for industrial purposes. Each spring, the ice melts, so the rooms are not the same year after year – there are always different walls, decor and furniture. Visitors are given thermal underwear, hats and sleeping bags. After a night on reindeer skins, guests are served breakfast with hot lingonberry juice. At any temperature outside, the rooms are not colder than -7°C .

3. Museum Hotel (Turkey, Cappadocia): A hotel in the caves of Cappadocia is essentially a “residential museum”. Each of the 30 rooms is decorated with valuable, and in some cases invaluable antiques from the Hittite, Roman, Seljuk and Ottoman times.

4. Dog Bark Park Inn (USA, Idaho, Cottonwood): A 10-meter beagle dog made of plywood and drywall is called Cutie Willie. The rooms are located in her stomach. The authors of the project are a married couple of artists, woodcarvers.

5. Cley Windmill (Great Britain, Norfolk): The windmill, built at the beginning of the 18th century, survived a lot, including filming The Conspirator with Elizabeth Taylor in 1949 and a flood in 1953. Today's owners converted it into a hotel. Comfortable rooms are not only in the mill itself, but also in the former stable and dovecote.
